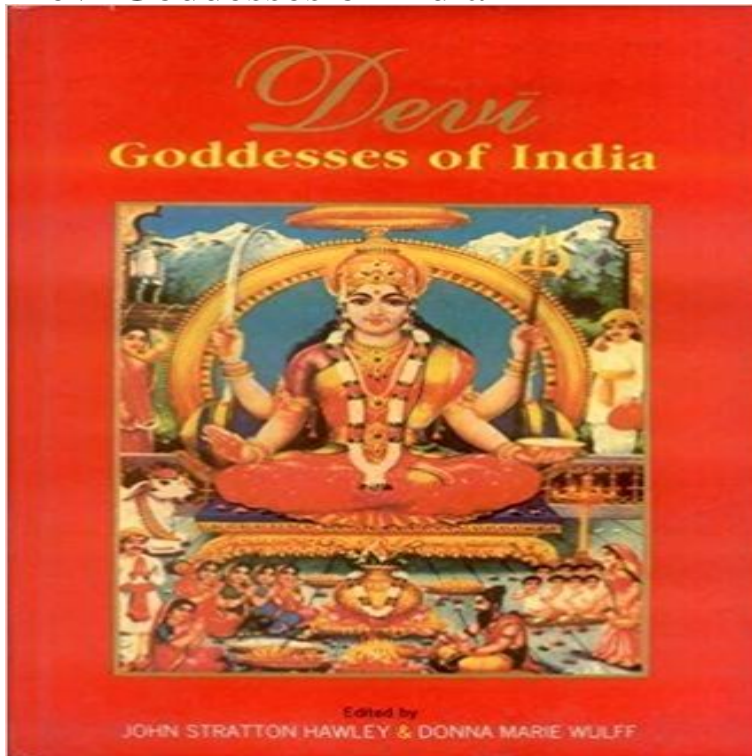


Devi Goddesses of India
