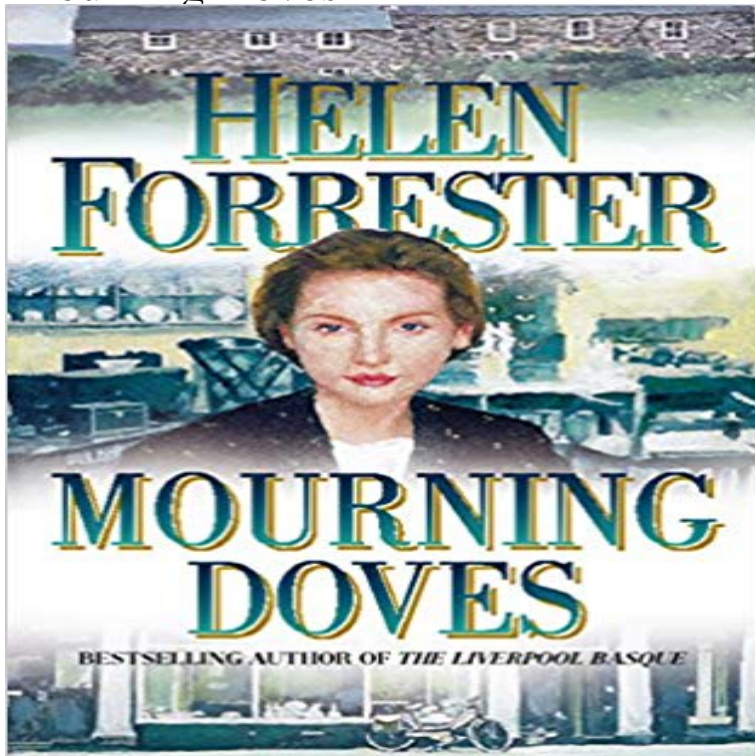


Mourning Doves
